

## WHAT TIME PERIOD IS COVERED IN ISAIAH?

The **ORDER** of the books of the Bible is **NOT** in **CHRONOLOGICAL ORDER!**

- I Kings** From King Solomon to the kingdom splits into Northern and Southern.
- II Kings** More about the Kings from both Northern Kingdom Israel and Southern Kingdom Judah.  
Fall of Northern Kingdom Israel to Assyria.  
Fall of Southern Kingdom Judah to Babylon.
- I Chronicles** Highlights of King David's reign.
- II Chronicles** Highlights of Kings of Southern Kingdom Judah.  
Fall of Southern Kingdom Judah to Babylon.
- Ezra** After 70 years captivity in Babylon, Ezra leads the Jewish expedition back to Jerusalem to rebuild the Temple that was completely burned by Babylonians.
- Nehemiah** After Ezra, Nehemiah came to rebuild the wall around Jerusalem.
- Esther** During the time period of Ezra and Nehemiah, Esther, the Jewish Queen of Persia (the nation which overtook Babylon and allowed the Jews to return to Jerusalem), put her life on the line to save the remaining Jewish people under the rule of the Persian Empire.
- Job** **NOT IN THIS TIME PERIOD AT ALL!** The story of Job goes back to **GENESIS**. His story of suffering was probably during the time of Abraham or shortly thereafter. His story was known by Moses and recorded by Moses.
- Psalms** During the time of King David and beyond with other writers.
- Proverbs** During the time of King David's son, King Solomon, and beyond with other writers.
- Ecclesiastes** Like Proverbs, during the time of King Solomon, the United Kingdom.
- Song of Solomon** Like Proverbs & Ecclesiastes, during the time of King Solomon, United Kingdom.
- Isaiah** Corresponds to the **same time period at the end of II Kings and II Chronicles**.
